
Through the cracks, do we upgrade or grow?

Through the cracks, do we upgrade or grow?

New fiber optic cables are being currently laid throughout the Netherlands. The Netherlands is preparing to upgrade to the next generation of information sharing, digital media, data loads and ultimately energy consumption. This temporarily visible infrastructure is one of the only signs of this upgrade on a material level to be seen.

The project I am sharing is the outcome of research made in The Goethe Institute Netherlands. While undertaking the investigative residency series in 2023, I honed in on the relationship light has with recorded memory today. Considering how memory is recorded with digital instruments, my attention focuses in on image and photography culture looking at its own material and ephemeral relations. Using a contemporary digital landscape, this work looks at how our memories are made, stored and move further and faster in the context of digital photography and at the new speeds it operates in contrasting what this really looks like.

The foundation of the information era is light and one of the most secure and sophisticated means of transporting this is through underground fiberoptic cables using laser light. The digital world largely uses invisible structures such as different frequencies on the invisible spectrum of light (electromagnetic energy) or infrastructures made to be invisible. A symptom of information communications technology (ICT) infrastructure is that when it becomes successful it disappears only to be reminded of it when it fails. Successful infrastructure becomes invisible. This can be seen in GPS satellites, cloud networks, underwater cables etc, and light is the ephemeral web that links all of this together.

This work is an attempt to reimagining and repositioning relations to these fast paced infrastructures as they remain hidden. This work is inspired by plants, root structures, nature relations and light harvested as a natural resource. Invisible light is foundational in making plants and trees grow, the lungs of our planet. Now that we seemingly have mastered the engineering of light as a species, can we still call our progress growth? Is upgrading the same as growing?

The work exhibited in the *Passage* of the Goethe Institute building uses sculptures and photography to highlight this rare moment of visibility and our relations to it as an important acknowledgment of the kinds of systems that are now integrated into our lives, reframing their position and expectations. This infrastructure can be thought of as the roots of our digital selves, our economies and our surveillances and much like how we handle a a living plant, we must do it with care. The project *Through the cracks, do we upgrade or grow?* Surfaces an attention by looking between the cracks of our buildings and in our pavements and asks questions of what do mediums such as photography today look like and what the infrastructure of digital memory and our information era feels like and what kind of growing is upgrading in todays digital societies?
